Our center is a play-based program. We get a lot of questions about why our students spend several hours a day engaged in play. The best way to explain it to adults is that play is a child's work. During play your child is building skills in all areas of development. Through play, children are learning how things work, how to use their bodies, how to solve problems, and how to get along with others. Play is an avenue through which children can express their emotions, build relationships with others, and master difficult experiences. Our teaching staff have been trained on how to facilitate development through play and intentionally structure their day and the classroom environment to foster development.

Families have the opportunity to set up an impactful play time at home. Here are three simple things to keep in mind when playing with your child.

- 1. Ask open ended questions.
- 2. Allow your child to lead the play.
- 3. Give your child opportunities to explore new materials and different environments.
